

Re - Shelter Box Australia - Off the Grid Challenge!

On Saturday 17 June 2023, the Rotary Club of Yass invites you along with your family, colleagues and/or mates to "Go Off the Grid" and camp outside overnight to a get a small glimpse of what life is like for those living in the aftermath of disasters.

Why you ask?

To raise visibility and critical funds for ShelterBox Australia - a not for profit organisation that provides worldwide humanitarian aid and relief in the form of a shelter and essential equipment to people displaced by natural and other disasters. The sturdy green Shelter Boxes contents differ depending on the disaster and climate- they contain a family size tent, essential tools people need to start repairing and rebuilding homes, solar lights, mattresses, thermal blankets, cooking utensils, water storage and purification equipment.

Founded in the year 2000 Shelter Box partnered with Rotary International has provided disaster relief in 97 different countries, supporting families to get back on their feet after hurricanes, earthquakes, conflicts, droughts, cyclones and more.

What is required?

- The challenge can be accepted by individuals, families, classes, clubs, entire schools or companies.
- The rules are simple, camp out for the night with no electricity and nothing with an 'on' button.
 Location the choice is yours, be it the humble backyard or go totally 'off grid' and camp out at our many free camp areas in our district.
- Get sponsorship to help. It is a wonderful way for others to get involved in what you are doing and help make the most of your effort.
- Easily set up your own ShelterBox fundraising page. Link is available on the Rotary Club of Yass
 Facebook page alternatively google <u>offthegrid.raisely.com</u>. For individuals feel free to jump on the
 Yass Rotary team, for groups you may like to create your own team.
