They had an amazing day with the sun shining on their swims and allowed many of our students to post PB's. One such competitor was Cruz Dunley. He managed to place 3rd overall for his 50m breast stroke with only 100ths of a second separating 1st and 3rd. Harmony Day

On Friday 22nd March, Yass Public celebrated Harmony Day. Harmony Day is a day to reflect on and celebrate the cultural diversity of our society. Australia is one of the most multicultural countries in the world and Harmony Day reminds us of the importance of being inclusive, respectful and accepting of all backgrounds and cultures.



Students came to school dressed in cultural dress or wearing orange clothing and accessories. Orange is the official colour for Harmony Day. It was chosen because it represents meaningful communication, the freedom of ideas and the encouragement of mutual respect.

Students gave a gold coin donation, which the SRC members collected. YPS raised a total of \$393, with 5/6B raising the most with \$47.00. This money is going to our school's sponsor child, Clintone. Clintone is 11 years old and lives in Kenya with his mother father and three siblings. We have been helping support Clintone and his family for several years.




